COALITION UPDATES

- The Natick Board of Selectmen voted to recommend to the upcoming Spring Annual
 Town Meeting that they impose a moratorium on the establishment of Medical
 Marijuana Treatment Centers until April 1, 2014. On Feb 14, Erica will be attending
 one of three the "listening sessions" hosted by DPH and will be an opportunity to
 express concerns and recommendations.
- Shelley Joseph is representing NTY on the Natick Athletic Handbook revisions and update committee. There has been one meeting, with two additional to follow.
- Alcohol.edu will be given to the second half of the Freshmen class this term. The rest of the students will be given the course during Prom/graduation season.
- Erica did a presentation to the Natick Community Support group. The regional group provides services to elders and those in need. Their work and ours will collide around prescription drug prevention and medical marijuana.
- Several NTY members and school personnel heard Catherin Duvivier speak as part of the Project Alliance Speaker series. She talks about the need to support the 80% of students not at the top of the class and has a very positive approach. Many of us would like her to speak on opening day to our faculty.
- NTY is listed in the Natick Public School Wellness policy, which was revised by the Superintendent's Health Task Force, Chaired by Karen Rufo. NTY members Jim White, Dan Keefe, and Erica are on the committee.
- Parents Against Bullying co-hosted a well attended parent program on Resiliency. Christine Guthery and Christina Player of Natick Human Services presented. The program was supported by NTY and other area organizations.
- NTY has sponsored two Peer Leader from Kennedy to attend You Lead training. We are also sponsoring a group of 45 young women who will be attending the Empowering Girls Conference for Female High School Students. Lisa De Paolo, Christine Guthery and Beth Heffler will be chaperoning.
