## Impact of medicinal marijuana on Natick youth-What should NTY do?

- NTY is in agreement that Town Officials will address the needs of the community for regulation of Medicinal Marijuana
- Our role is to provide education in the community about marijuana to adults and youth
- The need is to create a social norms campaign using multiple strategies to reach people

- We need to prepare materials asap
- We need to develop a long term plan

## Many ideas were shared including the following:

- Create a scholarship to provide student incentives to develop a social norms campaign-use a model similar to the show "The Voice" to engage more people and use a mentoring approach
- Have a speaker for the kids who can talk to them at their level. There may be resources at MetroWest Medical Center.
- Develop a social norms campaign that reaches adults and kids
- Provide opportunities so that youth who may not be part of NPS can be involved
- Use social media and Facebook to reach our audience
- Create a campaign and then have follow up programming.
